Cem Yiğit Üzümoğlu was born in Istanbul, Turkey in 1994. He gratuated with high honour from H.Ü. Ankara State Conservatory Acting Department in 2016 and did a Masters in Dramaturgy at Istanbul University.

While studying, he worked with Teatro Astragali and Aleksandra Kazazou. In 2016 he worked as an assistant choreographer to Selçuk Göldere, in Calcutta, India. He later went to Grotowski Institute to work with Studio Matejke, where he took part in the short film "Falling" with the support of the institute. The film has been awarded "Spectators Choise Award" in Cinedans Festival.

In 2017, him along Aleksandra Kazazou and Karol Jarek created Teatr Andra and presented Troas" by Dimitris Dimitriadis. With this performance, he won the "Best Young Actor Award" of 21st Yapı Kredi Afife Theatre Awards. Other performances with Teatr Andra include "Salto" in 2018 which was presented in İstanbul and Thessaloniki.
